Fifth Sunday of Easter B

On this, the Fifth Sunday of Easter, we continue our Easter celebration, which will carry on until Pentecost.

St. Paul was one of the strongest preachers in the early Church. But we first encounter him as one who persecuted the Church with great energy. It would take a powerful and painful conversion experience to get Paul to apply his considerable energy and commitment to the building up of the Church, rather than to its destruction; we hear about this conversion in the First Reading today.

In the Gospel, Jesus tells of the vine and its branches, and of the need for pruning to bring out the strength and fruit of the bush. If the Church is the vine, with Jesus at its centre, what will pruning look like, and feel like, for us as a Church? Pruning means that certain unproductive branches are cut away, so that they do not continue to sap the energy of the vine; what could be a practical example of this for our parish? And if you as an individual are a branch on this vine, how prepared are you to identify and offer for pruning those "twigs" in your life that are not producing Christian fruit?

Pruning hurts. Conversion hurts. Because in both, something must die and be discarded. Is eternity worth the pain?
